In addition to the 50 states, we have also included the District of Columbia, Chicago, and New York City, each of which have their own codes.

The list includes two columns of web links. The blue links are to the ICC web page that describes that State's codes. The red links are other links we have found to have additional helpful information, usually direct to the site of the governmental agency responsible for adopting codes. Always check with your local jurisdiction to verify the code that is in effect in your area. We have attempted to make this list accurate, but there are many nuances to local code adoption that may vary from what we have on this list.
