 Case acceptance decisions are guided by priorities established by the local office with input from local communities and approved by our governing board.


## **Board of Directors - Regional Representation**

- Boosting the economies of Alaska communities
- In addressing client legal problems,
  ALSC secures millions of dollars in
  direct federal benefits for eligible
  families, stimulates local spending,
  sustains private sector jobs, and spares
  state and local budgets the costs of
  responding to family crises triggered by
  domestic violence, foreclosure,
  eviction, or lack of healthcare.
- Positive outcomes are achieved 86% of the time.

92% of low-income Americans do not seek

**1.** Do not know where to find help.

- **2.** Do not know if the problem is "legal".
- **3.** Decide to deal with the problem alone.


Justice Gap




# Alaska Legal Referral Network






## Locally sourced community justice workforce

## Alaska Bar Rule 43.5 Waiver

- Train on rules of professional responsibility
- Provide supervision as needed
- Community justice workers practice exclusively for ALSC
- Informed consent
- ALSC puts candidates up for approval
- Scope can evolve with evidence
