FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB68-S

Analysis

This bill advances the People's First Initiative by making substantive and conforming amendments to statutes relating to human and sex trafficking and sex offenses. This bill will further strengthen Alaska's criminal justice system to protect victims, hold offenders accountable, and make Alaska safer.

The original version of House Bill 68 included language expanding the duties of the Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (CDVSA) to include sex trafficking. The committee substitute adopted in the House Judiciary committee removed the sections 30 and 31 of the original bill that amended Alaska Statute (AS) 18.66.010 requiring the CDVSA to provide planning and coordination of services to victims of sex trafficking and amended AS 18.66.050 expanding the duties of the CDVSA to include sex trafficking. As such, the Department of Public Safety CDVSA is submitting an updated zero fiscal note for the adopted committee substitute.
