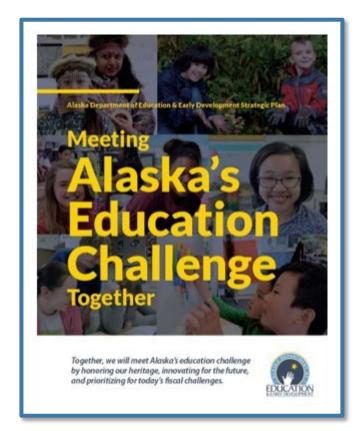

Five Shared Priorities:

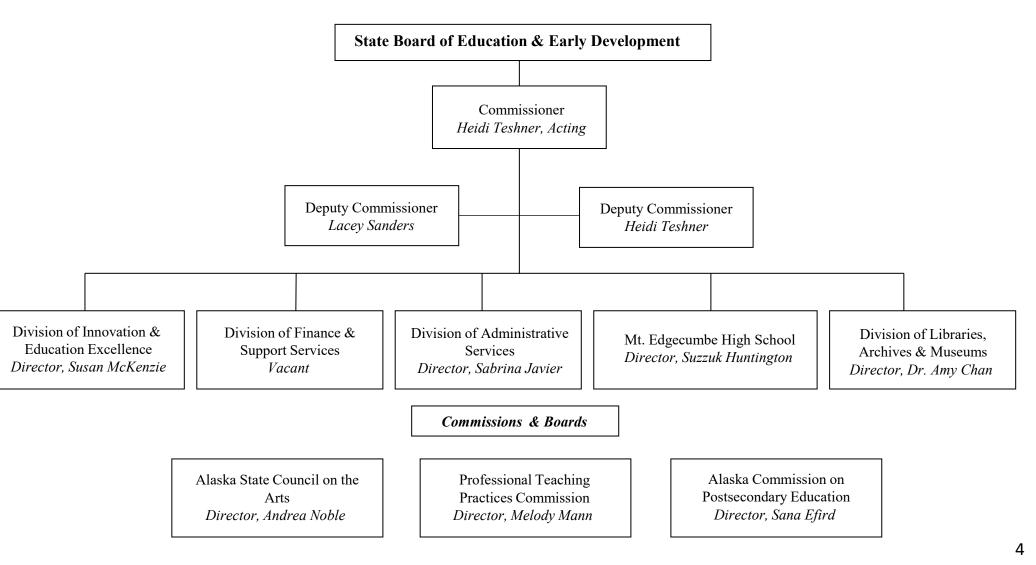
- 1. Support all students to read at grade level by the end of third grade.

- 5. Improve the safety and well-being of students through school partnerships with families, communities, and tribes.



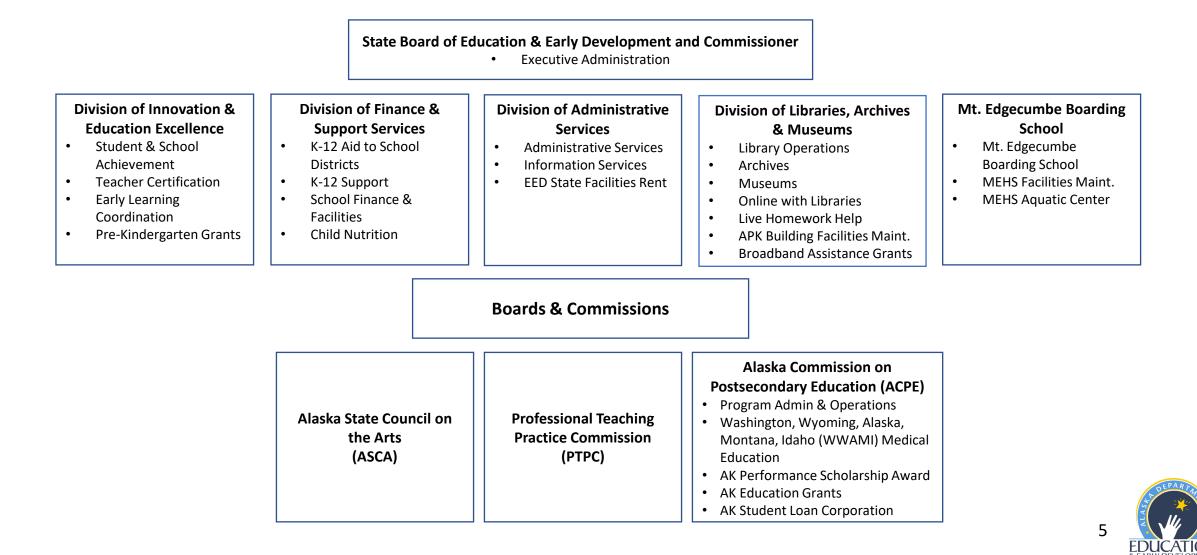

Department of Education and Early Development Organizational Chart

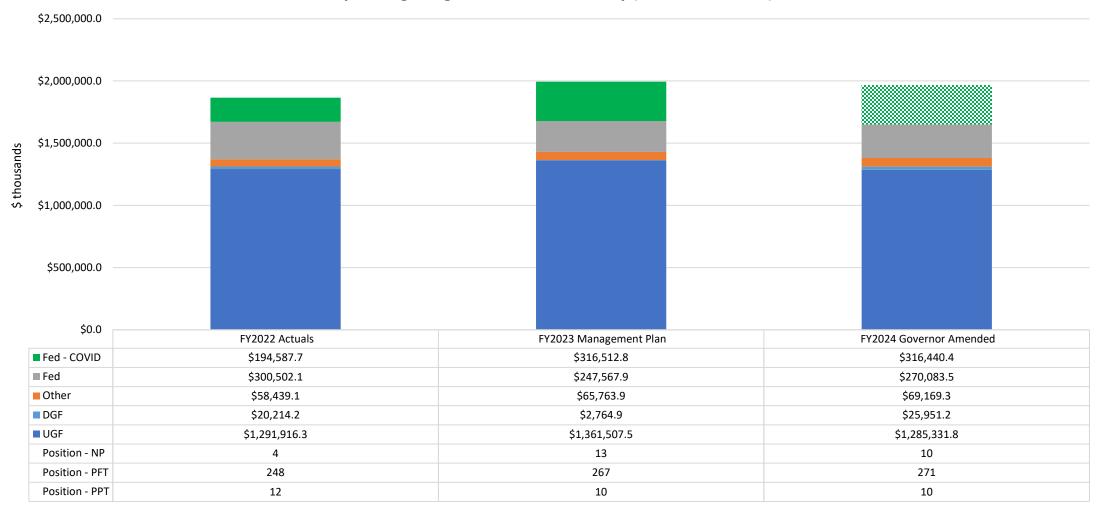


Department of Education and Early Development Budget Organizational Chart

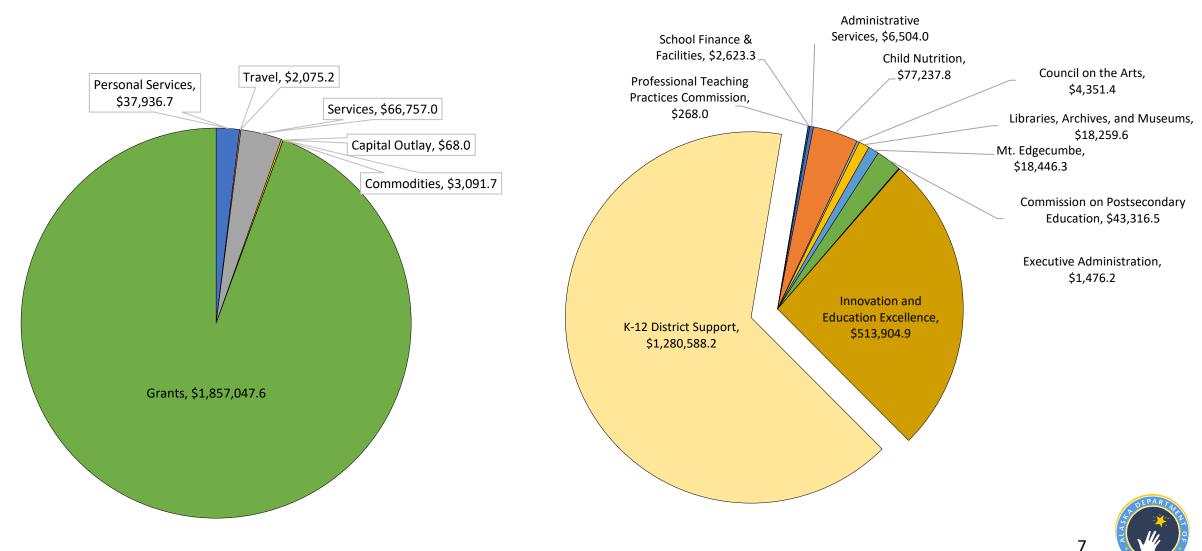

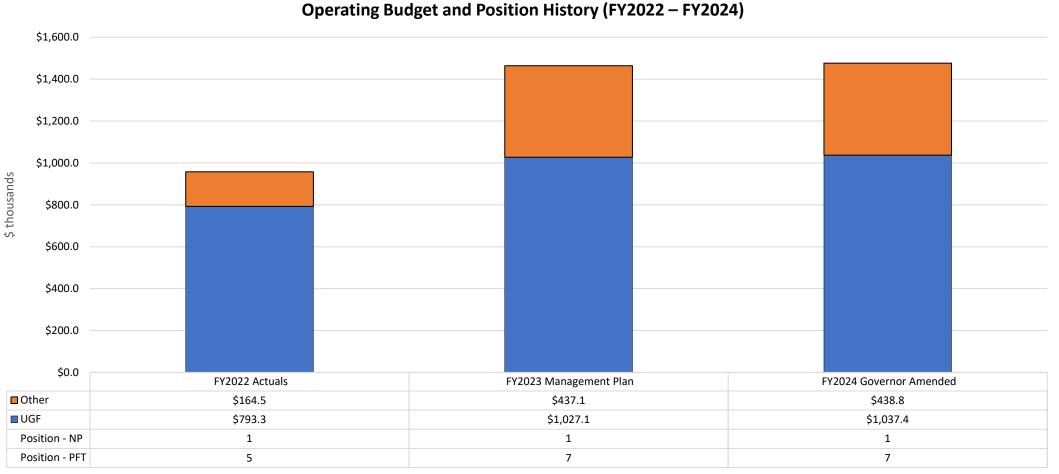


Department of Education and Early Development FY2024 Governor's Budget (\$ thousands)

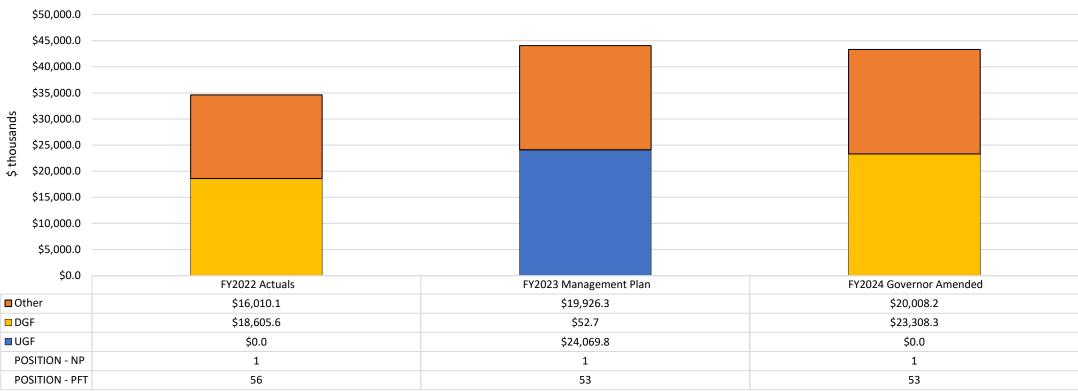

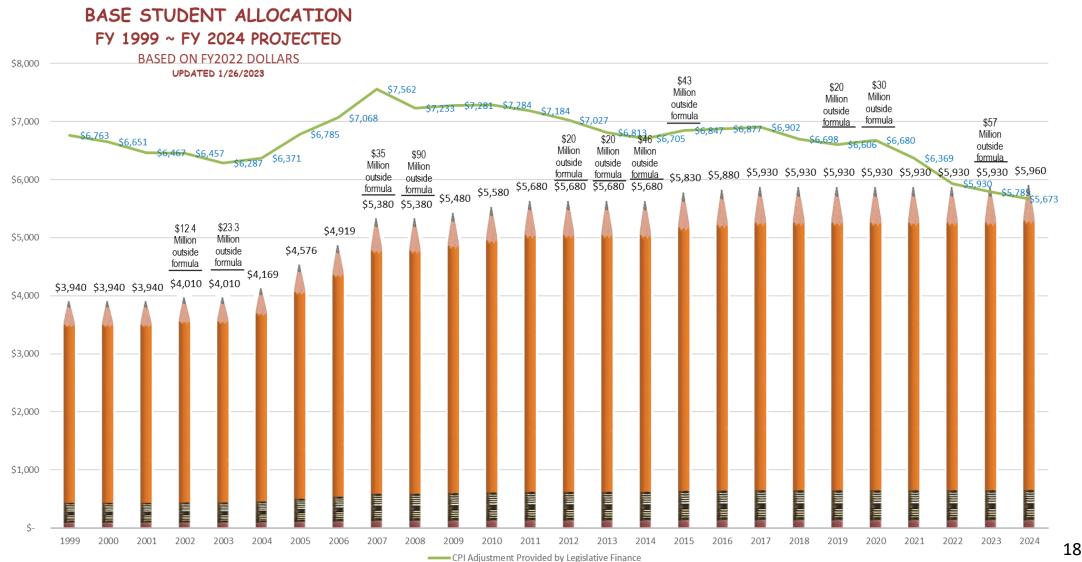

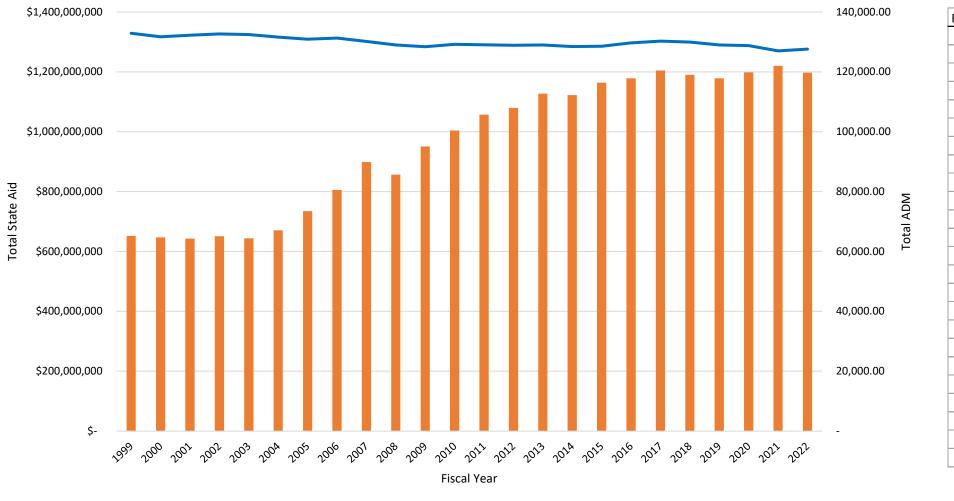

Total State Aid vs Total Average Daily Membership (ADM)

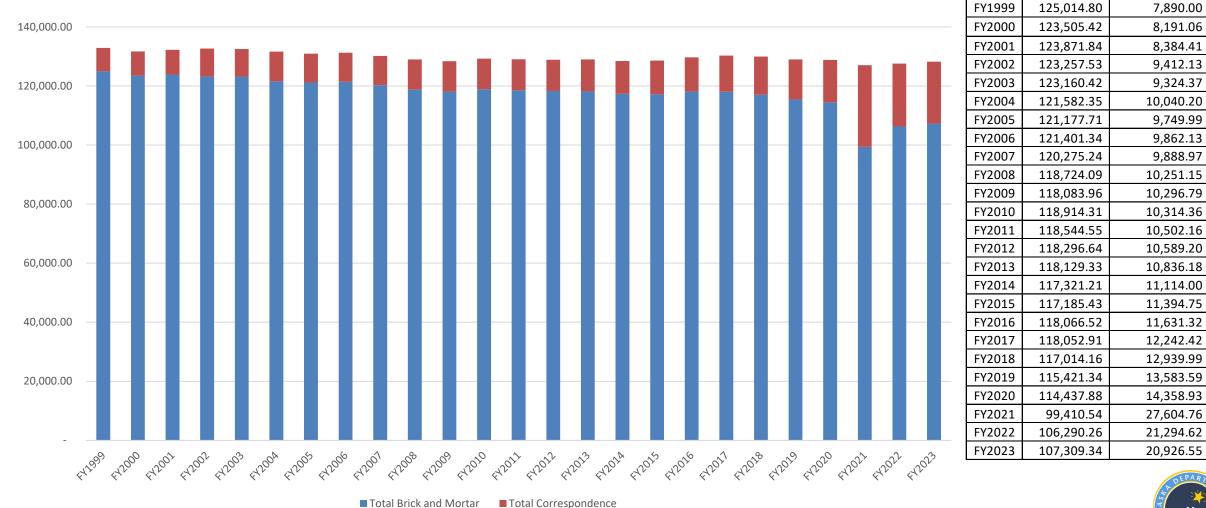

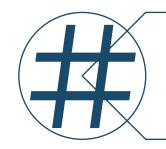
