FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill amends Alaska Statute (AS) 46.03 to add a new section to article five regarding the use of firefighting substances. The bill prohibits the use of firefighting substances containing perfluoroalkyl substance or polyfluoroalkyl substance in Alaska unless required by federal law or regulations adopted by the State Fire Marshal.			
While the bill will require the State Fire Marshal to adopt new regulations if an alternative firefighting substance recognized by the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration's Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory Program is determined to be safe and effective, department does not anticipate any fiscal impact from the bill.
