- Parents have the primary authority to decide how and where a child is educated.
- "The child is not the mere creature of the state."
- Pierce v. Society of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, 268 U.S. 510 (1925)



→ Common Points of Agreement in Court Rulings Align With Dr. Friedman's Vision

1955 Modern Voucher Idea of Dr. Milton Friedman, Nobel Laureate Economist:

Parents receive public funds to pay tuition at any school of their choice — including public or private schools, or unforeseen ways to educate in the future.

"Government, preferably local governmental units, would

give each child, ✓

through his parents, ✓

a specified sum √

to be used solely in paying for his general education; <

the parents would be free to spend this sum at a school of their own choice." ✓

Money Matters

- At the moment when a parent receives public funding directly for the benefit of a child, the "circuit between government and religion" is broken.
- Parent's choice of school is attributable solely to the parent, not the state
- Zelman v. Simmons-Harris, 536 U.S. 639 (2002)

Espinoza v. Montana Dept of Revenue

"A State need not subsidize private education, [b] ut once a State decides to do so, it cannot disqualify some private schools solely because they are religious."



Carson v. Makin

"[T]he prohibition on status-based discrimination under the Free Exercise Clause is not a permission to engage in use based discrimination."
