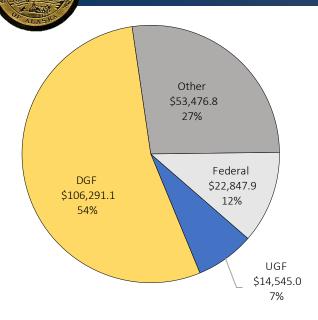


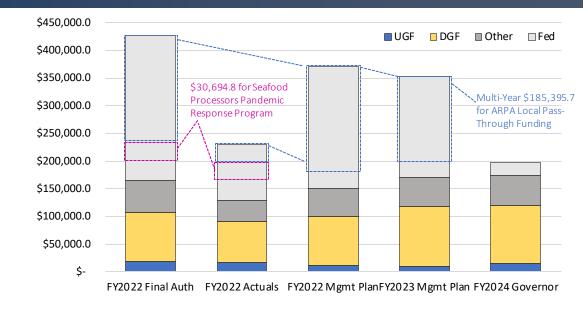
#### Department Structure

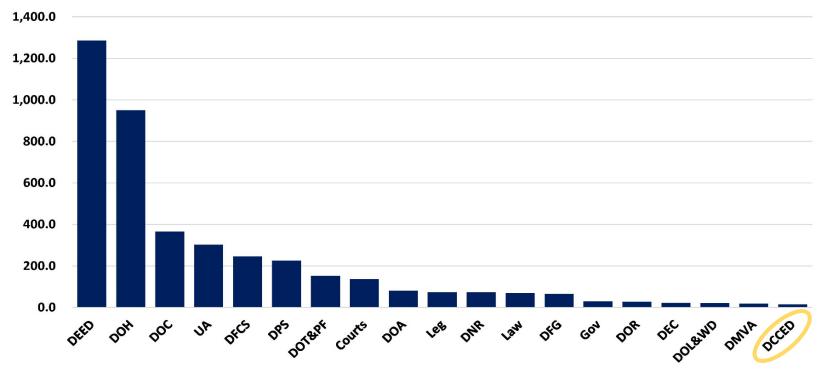

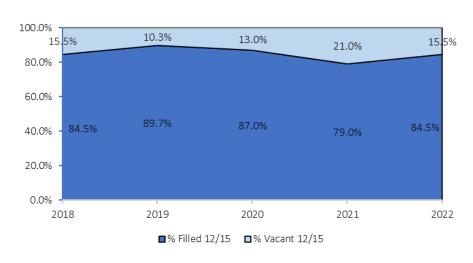
