



API reopened the Denali unit (March 2022) as a dedicated service location for adults with neuro cognitive disabilities. After this change we observed a decrease in patient on staff assaults. This decrease was 55% over the prior year in our adult patient population.



# **Discharge Transition Support Program**















health provider



Discharge transition support program to successfully move patients to an assisted living facility and community-based care.

- Barriers to overcome with this program:
  - Medication management seeking a medication provider
  - Activities of daily living patients require more assistance with activities of daily living
  - Behavioral plan education & "Warm hand-off" with Assisted Living Facilities
  - Individual difficulty with transitions meeting the patients special needs

# Case Carrying Workforce Turnover & Departure type











# DJJ Locations





- Slow increase in crimes against persons
- All other crimes on a longterm downward trend
- Covid lockdowns = artificial decrease in crime for FY2020-2021
- Annual referrals still below pre-pandemic FY2019 totals


