FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

The bill changes the definition of "blockbusting" as it applies to the sale and rental of real property to include "sex" as a protected class. The language also probably narrows who is subject to the law; a person who engages in the discriminatory real estate practice but does not benefit financially is likely removed from the definition.

The bill adds three definitions to AS 18.80. In doing so, it codifies the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights' (the "Commission's") current practice, on the advice of the Alaska Attorney General, in accepting and investigating employment discrimination complaints based on a person's gender identity or sexual orientation. The bill's definitions also grant the Commission jurisdiction over gender identity and sexual orientation discrimination claims in places of public accommodation, the sale and rental of real property, credit and financing practices, and practices by the State of Alaska and local government by aligning the state definition of "sex" with "sex" under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

The bill does not change any current program at the Commission, and since 80% of the Commission's cases are employment related, the agency is already processing the bulk of cases that this bill otherwise grants the Commission jurisdiction over. Further, the Commission was investigating all of the bill's jurisdictional cases from approximately December 2, 2020, through August 16, 2022; this did not have a significant fiscal impact and if anything, allowed the Commission to accept additional federal receipts due to its workshare agreement with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

The Commission has the capacity to accept the slight increase in cases anticipated by the bill and therefore submits a zero
fiscal note.
