## St. Michael's Cathedral

- The building was completed in 1848 (when Alaska was under the control of the Russian Empire).
  - 20 years before the Alaska Purchase.
  - First Fastern Orthodox Cathedral in the New World.
- Significant Historical & Cultural value to the State of Alaska.
  - National Historic Landmark since 1962.
    - More prominent than the national Register of Historic Places.
  - Legacy of the Russian influence in the North Pacific.
  - In 1909, a scale-model replica was produced for a Smithsonian exposition.
- St. Michael's is a major attraction to visitors and tourist groups.
  - The tourism industry offers specialized tours of the Cathedral.
    - Widespread economic benefits to the local community.
- 1. This appropriation (\$70k) is non-secular in purpose.
  - It is <u>not</u> intended to facilitate or endorse the teachings of the Orthodox Faith.
  - It is intended to ensure the safety of the cathedral's bell tower (a 'Public Purpose').
  - It does not give the state authority to exercise oversight or control over the cathedral's activities.
- 2. Time & weather have taken their toll on this historic building.
- 3. To lose this landmark to decay would be a significant cultural & historical loss to our state.
- 4. This funding will support immediate stabilization of the bell tower to maintain the safety of the public and this historic landmark.
