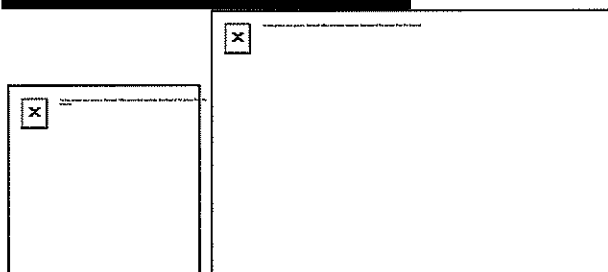

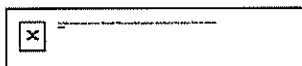

I am writing to support HB 105. Even Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg held in *Granville v Troxel*, "The Fourteenth Amendment Due Process Clause has a substantive component that provides heightened protection against government interference with certain fundamental rights and liberty interests, *Washington v. Glucksberg*, 521 U. S. 702, 720, including parents fundamental right to make decisions concerning the care, custody, and control of their children, see, e. g., *Stanley v. Illinois*, 405 U. S. 645, 651. Pp.63-66.

Sadly, these rights are not being respected by school districts in this state. 25% of the student population in the FNSB now attend publicly funded correspondence schools outside of the local district. The failure of the school district to respect parent rights and to view parents as the enemy is destroying local public education. When parents see a shroud of secrecy and suspicion around the classroom, they will seek other educational avenues.

For example, schools in Fairbanks are not providing the two week notice required by law. Further, it is the explicit policy of the district to withhold information from parents- please see the segment below:



Parents have had no mechanism of redress. What HB 105 does is give parents an avenue to redress problems in the district. The state really needs the enforcement piece of HB 105.
