Analysis

This legislation changes the legal age for possessing and purchasing tobacco and tobacco products from 19 to 21. The offenses in this area of law are violations which the Criminal Division, generally, does not handle. Therefore, the Criminal Division does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation.
