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## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## STATE OF ALASKA 2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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## Analysis

Senate Bill 65 changes multiple requirements relating to the sex offender registry (secs. 4-7), requires consecutive jail time for a person convicted of two or more offenses of violating conditions of release (sec. 3), adds additional offenses to the definition of "sex offense" for which a person is required to register (sec. 8), and adds crimes to the list of offenses that comprise the definition of domestic violence (sec. 9). These changes are not anticipated to have a material effect on the court's caseload.
In addition, Section 12 would amend a court procedural rule to allow any evidence that the prosecutor believes would be admissible at trial to be admitted at the grand jury stage of a case, and further amends that court procedural rule to allow the prosecutor to present hearsay evidence in all grand jury proceedings. This would change the way evidence is presented to a grand jury but would not have a fiscal impact on the court system.
The court system therefore submits this zero fiscal note.
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
