Established on **December 14, 2021**. The Council was tasked with preparing recommendations and a report for Governor Dunleavy by September 30, 2022.


The Council's 13 voting members and two exofficio members worked tirelessly with subcommittee members to develop the recommendations submitted on September 28, 2022.










