HB26 also proposes to rename the Alaska Native Language Preservation & Advisory Council as the Council for Alaska Native Languages and increase the number of voting members on the council from five to seven.

By doing so, the State of Alaska is demonstrating its commitment to preserving the cultural heritage of its indigenous peoples and ensuring that future generations have the opportunity to learn and use these languages.
