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Analysis

This legislation makes it a class B misdemeanor to knowingly possess or sell a used detached catalytic converter or purchase a used detached catalytic converter or any nonferrous metal part of a catalytic converter if the person is not a scrap metal dealer. This prohibition does not apply to a person who is engaged in the business of selling or possessing detached catalytic converters and has registered with the Department of Public Safety. There are also a number of exemptions including if a person is working with catalytic converters and needs to detach them or if a person has other documentation indicating that the person possesses the converter as the result of a replacement of a converter for that person's vehicle. The Criminal Division does not anticipate a significant increase in cases due to this legislation and, therefore, does not anticipate a fiscal impact.

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
