FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. SB 61

Analysis

This bill amends AS 15.30 relating to national elections by adding new subsections to establish the “Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote” to confirm Alaska’s participation in the national popular vote interstate compact and makes conforming amendments. If passed, Alaska’s three electoral votes would go to the presidential candidates with the most votes nationwide.

Passage of this legislation would have no fiscal impact on the Division of Elections. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
