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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. CSHB 148(EDC)

Analysis

The bill amends the qualification criteria of an Alaska Performance Scholarship (APS) applicant by adding an option for career and technical education (CTE) to the academic curriculum, inserts a definition for career cluster, removes the minimum score on college entrance or standardized examination requirement and adds language to allow for a Grade Point Average (GPA) or a minimum college entrance examination to qualify instead of requiring both, adds a requirement for school districts to notify students in their junior year of their progress towards earning APS eligibility and requires districts to inform students in 9th and 10th grade about the APS, increases the annual award amounts (see table below), provides an additional two years for students to use the scholarship after high school graduation, and allows eligible award recipients to qualify for an increased award level while enrolled at a qualified postsecondary institution.

• Level 1: 3.5 GPA or above or a very high minimum score, \$7,000 (increased from \$4,755)

 Level 2: 3.0 GPA or above or a high minimum score, \$5,250 (increased from \$3,566) Level 3: 2.5 GPA or above or a moderately high score, \$3,500 (increased from \$2,378)
Per AS 14.43.915(c), of the total amount available annually to the commission for payment of grants and for payment of scholarships, one-third of the combined amounts shall be available for payments of grants. Therefore, an increase in the APS total amount available for award would result in an increase in total amount available for Alaska Education Grants (AEG).
There is \$5,841.3 of Higher Education Investment Funds (HEIF) in the FY2024 Governor's Request which funds the AEG.
