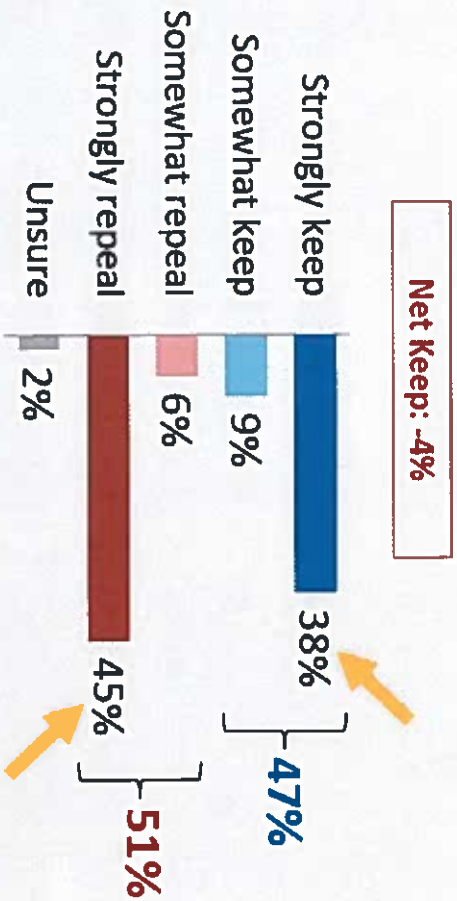


# Ranked Choice Voting

In 2020, Alaskans voted to change Alaska's system for voting to one with open primaries and ranked choice voting. This new system for voting was used for the first time in Alaska's election last year. There are currently groups who support and oppose this new election system. An opposition group may seek to repeal the new voting system in next election through the ballot initiative process.
