FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation proposes changes to Alaska's election laws that would eliminate the open primary system and ranked choice voting system.

Should this bill pass, a public education campaign would need to take place in FY24 and FY25 to inform candidates, voters, and election workers of the changes to the primary and general election processes.

The Division of Election estimates the costs associated with conducting a multimedia public education campaign (including media such as television, radio, newspapers, magazines, internet websites and mobile digital devices, and outdoor advertising such as signs or billboards) to be \$2,500,000. These costs include advertising in English and other languages as required by the language assistance provisions of the Federal Voting Rights Act.

Based on past practice, the Division requests a two-year appropriation covering FY24 and FY25 costs if this legislation passes.
