I oppose House Bill 4 - the proposed legislation that would Repeal Ranked Choice Voting and the Open Primary. In 2020, Alaskan voters, frustrated with the previous election process, voted to change to ranked choice voting and the open primary. With the experience of only one general election, it is premature to make drastic changes such as repeal of ranked choice voting.

I have worked as an election official at every state election in the past twelve years. At our local precinct at Airport Heights School in Anchorage, voters seemed happy with the 2022 primary election and there was little confusion. In fact, in previous years many people expressed dissatisfaction with the former closed primary system, where voters often could not vote for who they wanted. In August 2022, many voters at our polling station were happy to be able to choose between all candidates. At the November 2022 election, while it took many people more time to fill out their ballot, most people seemed to figure out how to rank the candidates and I heard very few complaints from voters.

Please do not pass HB 4.

Dear Representative Vance,

As a supporter of Ranked Choice Voting I listened to the recent hearing with public comment on H84, which would repeal ranked choice voting.

Two points were made by you that I beg to differ with.

1. Ranked Choice Voting destroys "one person one vote".

Ranked Choice preserves and protects "one person one vote". Each voter votes only once, using one ballot. If there is no majority winner among the first-ranked candidates (the "first round"), there is then essentially an "instant run-off' using the 2nd, and if necessary 3rd and 4th ranked candidates. Each voter's ranked choices from their ballot are preserved and used, assuring that the voter's voice is heard. No second run-off election is needed, no-one needs to come back and vote a second time. Actual run-off elections are known for low voter turnouts, effectively allowing a small set of re-voters to vote a second time and determine the outcome. Ranked Choice preserves all voters' voices until there is a majority winner.

The key is that Ranked Choice is a new system, and like anything new, we all need to learn. If we were all novices in the last election, we will all be experts by the next one. To vote effectively everyone should always rank all candidates. No longer must you try to out-guess the other voters and decide if your favorite candidate would be just a "wasted vote". Simply vote for your best candidate, then rank all the lesser candidates too. If the first-ranked vote is split with no majority winner, the Ranked Choice process will give us a winner that the most of us DID vote for, whereas the old system could give us someone that most of us did NOT vote for.

2. Ranked Choice requires a "mistrusted" computer to tally the votes.

Computers are fast and efficient. But if there is mistrust, Ranked Choice ballots, like all ballots, could be counted by hand. If there is no majority winner of the first-ranked candidates, then just go thru the ballots again by hand and look at the second ranked candidates, and so on. Simple.

Please reject this attempt to repeal open primaries and ranked choice voting. Unlike our elected officials, I, like most Alaskan voters, do not belong to any political party and do not want political parties to regain the disproportionate weight they had in the past in determining my choices in the general election. According to the Division of Elections, nonpartisan and undeclared voters (256,000) outnumber Republican, Democrat and Alaska Independent voters combined. Only one political party is pushing this bill to reverse the will of the voters - the Republican party. Less than a quarter of our state's voters belong to the Republican party. [Division of Election voter registration data shows 142,170 registered Republicans out of 586,318 total registered voters as of April 2022.] Despite overwhelming opposition to this bill in public testimony, Republicans (only) continue pushing this unpopular, unwanted bill forward for more hearings.

I like allowing every voter, regardless of party affiliation, to have an equal say in who advances from an open primary to the general election. The ranked choice voting process was explained clearly and was easy to understand. Open primaries and ranked choice voting logically motivate candidates to appeal to a broader (less partisan) base, rather than having candidates pitching more extreme views to win a primary and then trying to come across as responsive to a broader audience in the general election. Who is opposed to encouraging candidates to be more honest and consistent about their positions throughout the entire campaign? Who is opposed to an approach that rewards moderation and inclusiveness instead of narrow partisanship? Ranked choice voting is also financially efficient, eliminating costly run-off elections.



As registered voters, we strongly favor keeping our new election system in place as the majority approved in the 2020 election.

We support <u>open primaries and Ranked Choice Voting</u>. These two components of voting provide voters more choices and better representation. With a greater pool of candidates to choose from, as opposed to choosing a political party, competition is encouraged, and a candidate's qualities are emphasized.

Open primaries are a one-ballot system, which eliminates confusion of which ballot a voter gets and allows all to vote their choice regardless of party affiliation. In the Ranked Choice general election, voters then have the option to rank, or not, up to four candidates. Winning candidates require 50% plus one vote. This type of voting system encourages a healthier democracy.

Open primaries and Ranked Choice Voting have the potential to encourage greater voter participation. Of the 603,958 registered Alaskan voters in 2022, 54% are either nonpartisan or undeclared.

To the Honorable Committee Members of the House Judiciary Committee:

My name is Michelle Sparck, my Cup'ik name is Macuar and I am a member of the Qissunamiut Tribe of Chevak. I grew up in Bethel and have worked in politics my whole adult life. I am pleased to provide some observations to the Committee on our experience with the new election law, and how it pertains to HB4 under your consideration.

Get Out the Native Vote is a non-partisan statewide voter education organization housed under the Cook Inlet Tribal Council based out of Anchorage, and as its first ever director, we are proud to say that GOTNV was instrumental in assisting the Lt. Governor's office, the Division of Elections in improving operations in a number of the 131 precincts out of the 401 that rely on the U.S. Postal Service for delivery of election equipment and the close out process. We also assisted in the recruitment of emergency election workers, and surmounting a few other systemic barriers that are inherent in the challenging geography, and the cultural and language hurdles in our state.

As I'm sure you would agree, three statewide elections in six months was a marathon of voter engagement, and we'd like to share how we fared under the new voting law's first application in the 2022 election cycle. Having only 90 days to prepare for a new and unexpected statewide election was a challenge to us all in the passing of Congressman Don Young, and the Rural Native districts suffered consequences in the all by-mail ballot process. For House District 38 alone, we had an 11.29% ballot rejection rate, and nearly 1,200 ballots thrown out for House Districts 36-40. Perhaps most ballots went uncounted because of problems with information on the envelope, incorrect identifiers or a lack of a witness signature, but we remain concerned of how Saturday operations of the Postal Service in some precincts may have played a role in the rejection of 1,897 for having their ballot postmarked after election day.

However, we are comfortable contending that the qualities of the new election law did not factor into the rejection rate. While it may have been overwhelming for Alaskans to see 48 names on the special primary ballot, the Native community had already

supported the concept of an open primary for a dozen years. The Delegates to the 2011 Alaska Federation of Natives convention passed resolution 10, encouraging Alaskans to opt in as "undeclared" so they could choose the primaries they wished to participate in, while urging the Governor to provide In Person Absentee voting in the **villages**, and to have the Legislature allow for election day voter registration.

Consequently, we feel the pick-one open primary showed a representation rarely seen by our community, we had four Alaska Natives run for office, and two of them made the top five highest vote getters.

In 2015, AFN also passed a resolution supporting the Permanent Fund Dividend Voter Registration Initiative. Automatic Voter Registration is an amazing program, one that may be taken for granted, but one we cannot afford to lose as we work toward encouraging voter turnout.

Ranked Choice Voting does require a learning curve, and though it would have been a challenge to rank four candidates in our first experience, the fact that a candidate withdrew to have his name taken off the ballot made RCV a lot easier to explain where the least vote getter in the Special Election faced elimination, and so long as their supporter ranked at least a second choice, they remained involved in the instant run-off between the two remaining candidates. The law does not force voters to rank more than one choice, and exhausted ballots are a personal choice for voters who choose not to rank beyond their preferred candidate. To GOTNV, every vote counts, but we did observe that House Districts 36-40 only suffered 99 rejection ballots in this round. We also saw an increase of voter turnout by 4,526 over the June performance.

In our second experience with RCV in the mid-terms, HD36-40 had an even greater turnout of 6,819 more voters from the August special election, and a ballot rejection rate of 199. RCV did not seem to be a deterrent to voting, and voters did not suffer the same rate of rejection in either RCV ballots as we did with the all by mail special primary.

Perhaps the Native community may still need time for better consensus on the new election law; however, in the meantime, we are going about our duty to improve outreach and voter education in the lead up to the next statewide elections.

Following is the text of my prepared oral testimony that I gave at the first hearing on HB4. I was unable to get through it all due to running against the 2 minute limit. Accordingly, I am submitting this in writing.

Hello, I'm Mark Desinger from Anchorage. I have voted in every election that I have been eligible to vote in since 1971. Following is why I oppose House Bill 4.

Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) results in the winner being the person with the most support across the entire electorate which may not be the one favored by the most passionate base - the Silent Majority wins if you will.

I believe campaigns under Ranked Choice system are more civil with less negativity. Peltola's campaign is a perfect example of this.

RCV reduces exhausted votes: for instance, in the Alaskan election, even though my first-choice candidate might not have won, all my votes were eventually counted. Furthermore, in none of the races did I feel like I needed to vote <u>against</u> somebody; all my votes were <u>for</u> a candidate. lastly, I did not have to game the system to vote for whom I thought the *umost* electable"; I just voted for whom I thought was best.

RCV eliminates the need for run-off elections because the run off happens immediately. This spares the hassle to the voter to have to vote at two different times and lessens the cost to the State because the election happens at only once. The results are known more quickly than those from run-off elections.

The position that RCV is complicated is false, it isn't any more complicated than the Title Company making me sign the paperwork Mark Stephen Desinger rather than just my first name. Polls support this.

The position that it will be more expensive is false; Alaska has already paid for the upgraded equipment and training needed to conduct RCV. It's actually cheaper because there are no run-off elections.

The position that is helps only one political party at the expense of the other is false; the structure is apolitical. The winners in Alaska's last election are evidence: Dunleavy - conservation Republican; Murkowski - moderate Republican and Peltola -a moderate Democrat. Furthermore, it is instructive that Republicans are crying foul in Alaska and the Democrats are crying foul in Nevada. I think the real reason for HB4 is RCV weakens the power of the political parties.

The position that RCV delays the results is false; no election that I have participated in have had the results the next daytheresults are always at least a week later. I think the confusion comes from various organizations "calling the election" a few hours after the polls close using statistics on preliminary results and that these predictions are often accurate. These predictions are not the results.

The position that the person with the most votes can lose is based on the mistaken viewpoint that only the first round is "real" and the subsequent rounds are "changing the outcome". Even in the traditional voting method, the person with the most votes in the first election can lose in the run-off. An example of that was when Murkowski beat Miller in the 2010 Senate election after losing the primary.

I am disappointed that this bill to overturn the will of the people came at the very next legislative session. I hope that you all vote no on HB4. Thanks.

To the Honorable Committee Members of the House Judiciary Committee:

My name is Michelle Sparck, my Cup'ik name is Macuar and I am a member of the Qissunamiut Tribe of Chevak. I grew up in Bethel and have worked in politics my whole adult life. I am pleased to provide some observations to the Committee on our experience with the new election law, and how it pertains to HB4 under your consideration.

Get Out the Native Vote is a non-partisan statewide voter education organization housed under the Cook Inlet Tribal Council based out of Anchorage, and as its first ever director, we are proud to say that GOTNV was instrumental in assisting the Lt. Governor's office, the Division of Elections in improving operations in a number of the 131 precincts out of the 401 that rely on the U.S. Postal Service for delivery of election equipment and the close out process. We also assisted in the recruitment of emergency election workers, and surmounting a few other systemic barriers that are inherent in the challenging geography, and the cultural and language hurdles in our state.

As I'm sure you would agree, three statewide elections in six months was a marathon of voter engagement, and we'd like to share how we fared under the new voting law's first application in the 2022 election cycle. Having only 90 days to prepare for a new and unexpected statewide election was a challenge to us all in the passing of Congressman Don Young, and the Rural Native districts suffered consequences in the all by-mail ballot process. For House District 38 alone, we had an 11.29% ballot rejection rate, and nearly 1,200 ballots thrown out for House Districts 36-40. Perhaps most ballots went uncounted because of problems with information on the envelope, incorrect identifiers or a lack of a witness signature, but we remain concerned of how Saturday operations of the Postal Service in some precincts may have played a role in the rejection of 1,897 for having their ballot postmarked after election day.

However, we are comfortable contending that the qualities of the new election law did not factor into the rejection rate. While it may have been overwhelming for Alaskans to see 48 names on the special primary ballot, the Native community had already supported the concept of an open primary for a dozen years. The Delegates to the 2011 Alaska Federation of Natives convention passed resolution 10, encouraging Alaskans to opt in as "undeclaredn so they could choose the primaries they wished to participate in, while urging the Governor to provide In Person Absentee voting in the villages, and to have the Legislature allow for election day voter registration.

Consequently, we feel the pick-one open primary showed a representation rarely seen by our community, we had four Alaska Natives run for office, and two of them made the top five highest vote getters.

In 2015, AFN also passed a resolution supporting the Permanent Fund Dividend Voter Registration Initiative. Automatic Voter Registration is an amazing program, one that may be taken for granted, but one we cannot afford to lose as we work toward encouraging voter turnout.

Ranked Choice Voting does require a learning curve, and though it would have been a challenge to rank four candidates in our first experience, the fact that a candidate withdrew to have his name taken off the ballot made RCV a lot easier to explain where the least vote getter in the Special Election faced elimination, and so long as their supporter ranked at least a second choice, they remained involved in the instant run-off between the two remaining candidates. The law does not force voters to rank more than one choice, and exhausted ballots are a personal choice for voters who choose not to rank beyond their preferred candidate. To GOTNV, every vote counts, but we did observe that House Districts 36-40 only suffered 99 rejection ballots in this round. We also saw an increase of voter turnout by 4,526 over the June performance.

In our second experience with RCV in the mid-terms, HD36-40 had an even greater turnout of 6,819 more voters from the August special election, and a ballot rejection rate of 199. RCV did not seem to be a deterrent to voting, and voters did not suffer the same rate of rejection in either RCV ballots as we did with the all by mail special primary.

Perhaps the Native community may still need time for better consensus on the new election law; however, in the meantime, we are going about our duty to improve outreach and voter education in the lead up to the next statewide elections.

While this is a good system anywhere, it works particularly well for Alaska where a large portion of the electorate identifies as Independent.

I urge you to oppose HB 4. I think the voters' decision to create open primaries and use rank choice voting in general elections was a good one.

I like the opportunity to have a voice in selecting all the candidates coming out of the primary cycle. I also like the opportunity to rank all the candidates in the general election because even if my first choice gets knocked out I still have a say in the outcome. As a voter I can express more detailed preferences over the full range of candidates.

As a result of these changes, elections have become more democratic.

Some have argued that the ranked-choice system confuses voters. My wife and I had no problem understanding and voting in Alaska's 2022 ranked-choice elections. Survey research suggests that almost 80% of voters felt that the ranked-choice vote system was reasonably simple (https://urldefense.com/v3/_https://alaskansforbetterelections.com/wp-content/uploads/2022/11/Patinkin_Alaska_Exit_Poll.pdf_; !!LdQKC6s!Kj8J4KbKBoU2fBVPCXpexecCZI-5OpGojVSlfqlxFqXFuEHRKiqraGKhBqeDcWA97FNUlyKbYJXl3yENJHh4bgZW\$ linked on April 30, 2023). I am writing to express my opposition to HB 4. I wish I could testify in person because I think it's important you actually hear from me and the tens of thousands of Alaskans like me. I hope you will take the time to read my written testimony.

As a moderate who has lived in Alaska most of my life my experience has always been that my voice is ignored. I vote both Republican and Democrat so my representatives don't listen to me because I don't have the same voter registration as they do or have a different viewpoint. Because I base my vote not on political party, but on whether or not the individual is fair, reasonable, open to listening to the ideas from everyone and willing to work on a bipartisan basis to find solutions to Alaskan issues. I am Pamela Brodie. I live in Homer. I oppose HB 4.

I served as an election worker at Homer City Hall last year, and also in 2020, 2018, and 2016, so I am familiar with the voting process under the old system and the new one. We found that the vast majority of voters last year came to the polling station understanding the ranked choice instant run-off system, with the sole complaint that the State had provided more education than was necessary. The one common question we got was, "Do I *have* to vote for someone I don't like?" We assured them that they did not, and they were clearly relieved. A few voters volunteered that they disliked the new system, but an approximately equal number volunteered that they were very happy to return to an open primary. There were more than the usual number of spoiled ballots, but all were easily corrected. I feel confident that all the voters understood the new system by the time they cast their ballots, and that all ballots reflected the will of the voters. Many of my election worker colleagues have different political views from mine, and may differ from me regarding a preference for Ranked Voting over the previous system, but we all agreed that it worked fine on a practical level, at least at Homer 1.

I oppose HB 4 for several reasons. First, the Ranked Choice Instant Run-off Initiative passed by a vote of the people. It would be arrogant and contrary to Democracy for the legislature to overturn the vote of the people, based merely on anecdotes and an opinion poll showing a very slight majority against it. It should remain law unless the voters of Alaska vote to overturn it.

Second, I believe that America has become dangerously partisan in recent years. I am old and have lived through many troubles. But I have never seen so many Americans so afraid of and so angry at other Americans, and only because they disagree politically. Our elected officials should be trying to unite us, but too many contribute to the poisonous rhetoric in order to raise campaign funds.

In this disturbing environment, I am relieved and proud that Alaska is a leader among the States in improving relations among neighbors. For many years, Alaska has governed with bi-partisan coalitions. I wish Congress would do the same. Now we have ranked choice voting, and we are able to vote for and elect moderates who can and do form friendships across the political divide -- something that was the norm in Congress when I was young, and that is very rare any more. First of all the majority of Alaskan citizenry voted FOR ranked choice voting in an election. So to legislatively rescind it is to go AGAINST THE WILL OF THE PEOPLE.

Ranked Choice Voting has many benefits.

Ranked-choice voting reveals the candidate with the most support across eclectorate population. The results do not reflect only the most passionate base. A candidate that might be the 2nd choice of a majority, not just a plurality (enough to win but many fewer voters choosing the person than 50%) can win. This means more people support that candidate, and that candidate represents more people than in the older "most votes wins" elections.

RCV prevents wasted votes, allowing a broader range of voting options. Because people can vote for more than 1 candidate, in order of preference, moderate candidates that might not be a first choice can win. In the old voting system, a vote for a candidate with a small following was wasted. Now, the voter can support the favored candidate but the 2nd choice will still count.

RCV Eliminates the need for multiple elections. In elections that have runoff requirements, ranked-choice voting allows a winner to be found in a single trip to the polls for voters.

RCV requires candidates to build broad majority coalitions. Since second choices matter and candidates must earn broad support,, candidates are incentivized to reach beyond their base.

RCV encourages positive campaigning and civility. Candidates running under RCV are less likely to attack an opponent since they don't want to alienate their opponent's voters and risk losing second or third choice votes they may need to win.

RCV may encourage more diverse candidates to run for office. They are not limited to a party; they can run as independents and still be on primary and secondary ballots. It may reduce party polarization, but it certainly reduces party control. I realize that this is why neither of our major parties likes RCV. It is one reason I DO like RCV.

In summary, please vote AGAINST HB 4 and TO CONTINUE Ranked Choice Voting.
