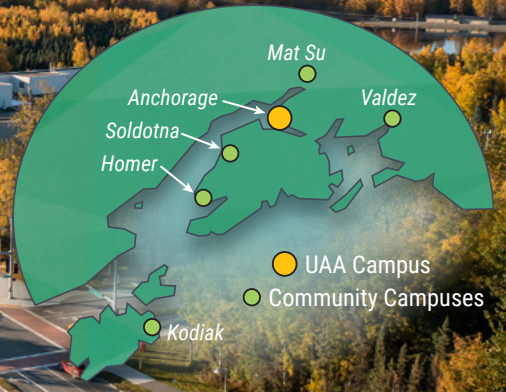




# UAA
