A RESOLUTION

1 **Disapproving Executive Order No. 127.**

2 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

3 **WHEREAS** the governor, under authority of art. III, sec. 23, Constitution of the State
4 of Alaska, has proposed in Executive Order No. 127 to transfer the functions relating to the
5 licensure, professional standards, and administration of massage therapy from the Board of
6 Massage Therapists to the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic
7 Development and to eliminate the Board of Massage Therapists; and

8 **WHEREAS** art. III, sec. 23, Constitution of the State of Alaska, provides that unless
9 disapproved within 60 days of a regular session by resolution concurred in by a majority of
10 the members of the legislature in joint session, an executive order becomes effective at a date
11 designated by the governor;

12 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Alaska State Legislature that Executive Order No. 127 is
13 disapproved.
