FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
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Analysis

The Department of Administration, Division of Personnel and Labor Relations, manages bargaining unit agreements for the state. Human resource and labor relations functions would likely be managed through a reimbursable services agreement with the Department of Administration, Division of Personnel and Labor Relations, to ensure consistency with requirements under personnel rules.

There are approximately 340 licensed child care providers with over 3,250 staff. This fiscal note is indeterminate because the number of individual bargaining organizations is impossible to determine.
