



Covenant House serves youth ages 13-24 experiencing homelessness and human trafficking in Anchorage Alaska Institute for Justice provides statewide legal and language services for human trafficking survivors in Anchorage and Juneau

Government Agencies Contributing Data



Data Compilation

Each agency verified their own data

Data questions sent to respective agency

Definitions may vary by agency

The Council compiled the data into a single location but did not validate the data

Demographics

- Total youth served: 750
- 203 unduplicated youths were screened
- 74 answered at least one trafficking question affirmatively
- 50 completed the Trafficking Victim Screening tool
- 22 youth had a likely/certain screening score for sex trafficking
- 4 youth had a likely/certain screening score for labor trafficking

Risk Factors

- Identified three common factors amongst most challenging clients, and of these, 75% of victims have two or more of the following:
 - Less than one permanent connection in their life
 - Suffered from disorders such as substance abuse, mental health or behavioral conditions
 - Had an income of less than \$1,341 monthly




