I've always been impressed with what seems to be her boundless level of energy, as she entertains a very healthy array of interests, both in the field and outside of it. You can rest assured that no moss will grow under this Commissioner's feet!

Since assuming this role in an Acting position last year, Kim has comfortably and enthusiastically reached out on behalf of the Department, to community members, to its employees, and to our community providers all over the state. I know her well enough to tell you that her heart is always in her work.
