


Establishments

Between March 2021 and March 2022, 2,514 Alaska establishments opened and 1,808 closed, for a net increase of 706. Employment expanded at 5,458 establishments and contracted at 4,297. Small businesses accounted for 2,408 establishment openings and 1,719 closings.


Employment

Opening and expanding Alaska establishments added 28,206 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 20,261, for a net increase of 7,945 jobs. Small businesses gained 23,623 jobs and lost 15,597, for a net increase of 8,026 jobs.

Thousands of establishments




Thousands of jobs

Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2021, reporting banks issued \$228.7 million in loans to Alaska businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. 

Small business exports

A total of 807 identified firms exported goods worth \$5.6 billion from Alaska in 2021. Of those exporters, 592—or 73.4 percent—were small. Exports by small firms reached \$2.7 billion, making up 48.6 percent of exports by identified firms.


