House Bill 28 – Access to Marijuana Conviction Records

Sectional Analysis for Version R

Section 1: Intent language stating the intent of the bill is to reduce barriers to employment and other basic daily functions for individuals who under past statutes were convicted of low-level marijuana related crimes.

Section 2: Adds the new subsection (f) created in Section 3 of the bill to the list of information that may not be released under AS 12.62.160(b)(8).

Section 3: Adds a new subsection (f) to AS 12.62.160 which establishes that an agency may not release criminal justice information for low-level, non-violent, marijuana possession charges which are no longer crimes under current statute so long as the offender was 21 years of age or older at the time of offense, was not convicted of any other criminal charges in the case, and requests the agency not release the records.

Section 4: Establishes the effective date of January 1, 2025.
