Analysis

This bill creates a new type of protective order for gun violence. The bill allows peace officers or household members who reasonably believe a person is a danger to self or others by having a firearm to petition the court for a gun violence protective order.

The bill requires the law enforcement agency to retain any surrendered firearms or ammunition until the gun violence protective order expires, and then requires the agency to return the firearms and ammunition to the respondent.

The DPS estimates that it may receive about sixty protective orders that require firearm relinquishment annually. Respondents may have one or many firearms and several rounds of ammunition in their possession.

The DPS will need to provide for secure storage space for firearms surrendered under gun protective orders. It is anticipated the department will need to maintain the firearms in the communities in which the respondent resides to ensure convenient pick up and return of the firearms; however, storage space in outlying posts is at maximum capacity. The department will need to identify a centralized evidence storage option in a central location, such as Anchorage, for small amounts of evidence to be transferred and stored. There will be costs associated with a lease for firearm and ammunition storage, as well as methods of transferring firearms, such as the postal service or department aircraft.

Centralized Storage in Anchorage	\$66.0 annually for 2000 square feet at \$2.75 per square foot
One Time Storage Set Up	\$60.0 for racks, loading area, modifications for ammunition storage
Transportation of Evidence	\$50.0 for shipping and department aircraft transfers of evidence
