Analysis

The Senate Judiciary Committee Substitute for House Bill 28, version R, eliminated the sections of the bill that impacted the court system; the court system already removes all of the marijuana possession cases described in the bill from its public case management system database (CourtView) pursuant to a Supreme Court rule that has been in effect since May 1, 2023. Also, the court system already posts information about records removed from CourtView and about how to obtain a criminal background check.

This bill does not impact the court system in any way and would not require any action or change in practices. The court system therefore submits this zero fiscal note.
