

**Total excludes PFD, Debt Service, and Special Appropriations



All Fund Types




Total FY23 Funding = \$134,451,500 (Excludes \$1,783,000 supplemental)

Contacts with Alaskans in 2022

- 107,184 new cases filed (trial and appellate)
- 6,268 contacts thru the Family Law Self-Help Center
- 3,526 Alaskans served on juries
- 6,877,425 visits to the court's website
- 1,846,301 CourtView searches
- 23,632 online payments made
- 386 therapeutic court participants
- Tens of thousands of on-line court forms accessed or downloaded





Trial Court Caseloads – FY21 vs. FY22



- FY22 Trial Court Case Filings Totaled 106,690
 - Up 4.8% from FY21 Total Trial Court Filings
- FY22 Superior Court Cases Totaled 22,215
 - Up 0.3% from FY21 Superior Court Case Totals
- FY22 District Court Cases Totaled 84,475
 - Up 6.1% from FY21 District Court Case Totals
