#### Water

- Oversee water quality standards, assessment & restoration

- Finance sanitation improvements
- Conduct inspections & determine compliance

- Manage cleanup of contamination
- Conduct inspections & ensure compliance




# Working Hard for Alaskans

#### **Environmental Health**

#### Air Quality

#### **Spill Prevention & Response**

clean air to breathe clean water to drink safe food to eat clean land and waters


