BILL NO. HB 2

Analysis

This bill creates a driving while under the influence (DUI) diversion program for individuals who have not been previously convicted of DUI. Participants in the program complete treatment if recommended, refrain from using alcohol or other controlled substances, and if successful in the one-year program are eligible to have charges dismissed. This bill provides for appointed counsel for individuals participating in DUI diversion.

This bill does not increase appointments to the Agency; therefore, the Agency submits a zero fiscal note.
