*** CARL E. MOSES ***


Carl was born July 16, 1929, and was raised from the age of two on Sanak Island in the Shumagin group of the Aleutians. At age thirteen, during WWII, he was “drafted” into the Alaska Territorial Guard. Military Officials came to his village one day, gave all the men armloads of clothing, rifles, and ammunition, and sent them out on reconnaissance, looking for Japanese patrols. During the Korean War, Carl was drafted for real, and spent his tour at Ft. Richardson as an artilleryman.


Carl began a commercial fishing career by working for his uncle, and eventually became owner / operator of seven vessels plying Alaska’s salmon and crab fisheries. His entrepreneurial interests eventually expanded to general merchandising, marine hardware, cocktail lounges, and inn-keeping. Until recently, Carl owned the Unalaska operations of the historic Northern Commercial Company, and perpetuated that operation as the longest continuously-run business in state history.

A successful businessman, Carl established himself as a capable public servant early in his career. At thirty-four, he won a seat on the King Cove City Council, served on the state Board of Fish, the board of the Alaska Rural Housing Authority, and eventually served twenty-two years in the Alaska House of Representatives. Ever the independent one, Carl Moses is the only person in state history who has been elected to statewide office from three different political parties; Democratic, Alaskan Independence, and Republican. Always attentive to his cultural roots, Carl was selected as the first president of the Aleut Corporation in 1975.

A self-educated man, Carl Moses is well known for his superior strategizing skills, his negotiating abilities, and his love of deal-making. His quiet, gentlemanly style has been applauded by all who have worked with him, as has his sense of duty, commitment, and humanity.
