

CHAPTER 3

AN ACT

To authorize the Secretary of State to appoint and commission notaries public; amending Sec. 17-1-1, Sec. 17-1-2, Sec. 17-1-3, and Sec. 17-1-4, ACLA 1949; confirming prior appointments and commissions of notaries public; and setting an effective date.

(S.B. 5)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 17-1-1, ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 17-1-1. **Appointment.** The Secretary of State may appoint and commission one or more notaries public for the State.

Sec. 2. Sec. 17-1-2, ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 17-1-2. **Qualifications and Residence: Term: Removal.** Every person appointed as a notary public must at the time of his appointment be a citizen of the United States and a resident of Alaska and must continue to reside in Alaska during his term of office; removal from this State vacates his office and is equivalent to resignation.

The term of office of a notary public shall be four years from and after the date of his commission, but he may be sooner removed by the Secretary of State for misconduct in office.

Sec. 3. Sec. 17-1-3, ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 17-1-3. **Bonds: Oath: Issuance of Commission.** Each notary must execute an official bond in the sum of \$1,000, which bond must be approved by the clerk of the division of the district court located nearest his residence. Upon approval of his official bond, so soon as he has taken his official oath, each notary public must transmit such bond and oath, signed by him with his own proper signature to the office of the Secretary of State, whereupon the Secretary of State must issue a commission.

Sec. 4. Section 17-1-4, ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 17-1-4. **Fee for Commission.** For each commission issued to a notary public a fee of \$10 shall be paid to the Secretary of State.

Sec. 5. All appointments and commissions of notaries public made prior to the effective date of this Act are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

Sec. 6. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval, or upon its becoming law without approval.

CHAPTER 4

AN ACT

Authorizing the Executive Director of the Legislative Council to transfer the sum of \$1,800.00 available in the biennial appropriation for the Legislative Council from items containing a surplus to an item where there is a deficiency; and setting an effective date.

(S.B. 6)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council is hereby author-

ized and empowered to transfer the sum of \$1,500.00 available from the 1957-59 appropriation for "Travel" and the sum of \$300.00 from the 1957-59 appropria-

tion for Legislative Council for "Capital Outlay" to cover current operation in appropriation for "Other Operating Expenses".

Sec. 2. No transfer of funds, as above authorized, will be effective for vouchering purposes unless and until the Di-

rector of Finance has been officially notified thereof in writing.

Sec. 3. This Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.

CHAPTER 5

AN ACT

To authorize the purchase of certain legislative copying, duplicating and collating equipment; and setting an effective date.

(C.S.H.B. 2)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. **Authorization.** The legislative fiscal officer is hereby authorized in accordance with proper fiscal procedure, to purchase and install the following equipment:

Two (2) Xerox Copying Units including the accessories thereto in an amount not to exceed \$10,750.00;

Two (2) Multilith Offset Duplicators, including the accessories thereto in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00;

Two (2) Thomas Collators, includ-

ing the accessories thereto in an amount not to exceed \$2,357.00.

Provided, however, the equipment herein described shall be placed under the control of the Alaska Legislative Council during the periods when not in use by the Legislature. These machines are for the exclusive use of the Alaska legislative processes.

Sec. 2. **Effective Date.** This Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.

CHAPTER 6

AN ACT

Setting the rate of compensation for employees of the Legislature; and setting an effective date.

(S.B. 29)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. **Rate of Compensation.** The employees of the Legislature shall be compensated on a daily basis, according to position, in conformity with the following schedule:

Position	Compensation Range
Chief Clerk and Secretary of the Senate	\$26.00 to \$35.00

Assistant Chief Clerks and Secretary	\$22.00 to \$24.00
Fiscal Officer	\$20.00 to \$22.00
Duplicating Supervisor	\$24.00
Duplicating Operators	\$19.00 to \$21.00
Stenographers	\$18.00 to \$21.00
Senior Typists	\$18.00 to \$21.00
Sergeants-at-Arms	\$18.00 to \$20.00
