

CHAPTER 82

AN ACT

To provide \$7,000.00 for the payment of school boards and physicians for physical examinations conducted during the biennium ending June 30, 1959 by authorizing the Commissioner of Health to transfer that amount from an item in the biennial appropriation for the Department of Health where there is a surplus; and providing for an effective date.

(C.S.H.B. 87)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The Commissioner of Health is hereby authorized to transfer the sum of \$7,000.00 available in the 1957-1959 appropriation to the Department of Health for "Remodeling Existing Hos-

pitals for Mental Health Brief Care" to the 1957-1959 appropriation for the "Physical Examination of School Children".

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.

CHAPTER 83

AN ACT

Authorizing the governor to purchase or receive and have engraved a sizeable piece of Alaskan jade for transmission to the proper federal authorities for insertion in the Washington National Monument.

(H.B. 107)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The governor is hereby authorized to purchase or receive by donation a sizeable piece of Alaskan

jade. This piece of jade is to be suitably engraved and transmitted by the governor to the proper federal authorities for insertion in the interior walls of the Washington National Monument.

CHAPTER 84

AN ACT

Authorizing an appropriation to the governor's contingency fund for the purpose of enabling witnesses to attend a congressional hearing to be held in the state capital; and providing for an effective date.

(C.S.H.B. 195)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby authorized an appropriation of \$3,500.00 to the governor's contingency fund for the purpose of paying the traveling expenses of witnesses and their other incidental expenses arising out of the hearing on the

fishing problems of the state to be held in the state capital during the month of April, 1959, before a subcommittee of the United States Senate.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.
