HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 9

Relating to the atomic energy project at Cape Thompson.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska in the First Legislature, First Session Assembled:

WHEREAS, the Atomic Energy Commission has shown continued interest in the nuclear excavation of Cape Thompson, Alaska; and

WHEREAS, this project is designed to demonstrate to the world the profitable and meaningful peaceful uses of atomic energy; and

WHEREAS, this interest in the Cape Thompson project has recently been effectively illustrated by the visit in Alaska of certain atomic scientists;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the State of Alaska in the First Legislature, First Session assembled, that by means of this resolution, and on behalf of the people of the State of Alaska, the proposed Cape Thompson project of the Atomic

Energy Commission is hereby endorsed, and the wish expressed that the development of said project follow careful planning and study pointed toward and consistent with, the health and welfare of the State and its residents; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the appropriate state agency extend all needed aid and cooperation to the Atomic Energy Commission in this demonstration of the peaceful use of atomic energy; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the Honorable Dwight D. Eisenhower, President of the United States; the Honorable John A. McCone, Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission; the Honorable E. L. Bartlett and the Honorable Ernest Gruening, Senators from Alaska; the Honorable Ralph J. Rivers, Representative from Alaska; and the Honorable Dr. Elison Shute of the University of California Atomic Research Laboratory.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 14

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska in the First Legislature, First Session Assembled:

WHEREAS, plans and surveys are now underway which are aimed at the eventual linking of southeastern Alaska

communities through a ferry system; and

WHEREAS, Baranof Hot Springs is one of the most suitable sites on Baranof Island for the necessary ferry landing and loading facilities; and

WHEREAS, a road across Baranof Island from the City of Sitka to Baranof Warm Springs would make such ferry facilities accessible to Sitka and island residents; and

WHEREAS, such a road would also open up the scenic and historic possibilities of Baranof Island and the City of Sitka to the increased number of tour-

ists who will utilize the ferry system; and

WHEREAS, the growing economy of the entire island would be benefited by the ease of vehicle transportation made possible by such a road;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the State of Alaska that the Commissioner of Public Works make an engineering survey of the feasibility and cost of constructing a road from the City of Sitka across Baranof Island to Baranof Warm Springs.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 16

Relating to the construction of a small boat harbor at Sitka.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska in First Legislature, First Session Assembled:

WHEREAS, the existing small boat harbor in the city of Sitka is presently occupied and used beyond its capacity; and

WHEREAS, with the abolition of fish traps the fishing fleet will undoubtedly be increased; and

WHEREAS, due to the activities of the Sitka Pulp Mill more tugs are entering and using the harbor area; and

WHEREAS, these same facilities must be used for floats and moorage of small amphibious planes, which activity has been augmented by the population increase and commercial expansion of the

Sitka area; and

WHEREAS, the need for enlarging the presently inadequate small boat harbor facilities is critical;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the State of Alaska that the Governor be and he is hereby requested to direct the Commissioner of Highways and Public Works to proceed with all dispatch to program the construction of a new small boat harbor facility at Sitka through the matching of state funds with funds provided by the city of Sitka, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of the State of Alaska and the Commissioner of the Department of Highways and Public Works.
