SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 15

Relating to the reconstruction of the footbridge across the Ninilchik River at the village of Ninilchik.

Be it Resolved by the Senate in First Legislature, Second Session assembled:

WHEREAS, the footbridge crossing from the village of Ninilchik over the Ninilchik River to the narrow peninsula of land on which the Berman Packing Company and Cold Storage facilities are located has fallen down and is, therefore, completely unusable; and

WHEREAS, the absence of the footbridge has made it necessary for those Ninilchik residents who are employed at the packing company's facilities to travel by a long and circuitous route of several miles in order to reach the place of their employment at the packing plant where approximately thirty-five workers are employed in the summer; and

WHEREAS, such a long and circuitous

travel route, being expensive, time-consuming, and inconvenient, imposes an undue hardship upon those residents of Ninilchik who are employed at the packing plant;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in First Legislature, Second Session assembled, that the Governor of the State of Alaska and the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works take such steps as are necessary to rebuild and restore the fallen footbridge across the Ninilchik River in order that the residents of Ninilchik may once again have the use of their customary and normal means of crossing the Ninilchik River; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the Honorable William A. Egan, Governor of Alaska, and to the Honorable Richard Downing, Commissioner of the Department of Public Works.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 17

Relating to the creation of a Vocational Education Executive Committee.

Be it Resolved by the Senate in First Legislature, Second Session assembled:

WHEREAS, it becomes increasingly apparent that there is a real need for additional vocational education in the public school system; and

WHEREAS, the federal government and several private foundations have expressed an interest in the furtherance of vocational education; and

WHEREAS, it is up to the state to investigate the possibility of procuring grants-in-aid for the furtherance of vocational education in this state;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in First Legislature, Second Session assembled, that a Vocational Education Executive Committee be formed to be composed of the secretary of state, as chairman, a member of the staff of the Department of Education, a faculty member of the University of Alaska, a member of the legislature or from the state at large, and a member of the educational staff of the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that this committee determine the need, desirability, feasibility, cost, benefits, and availability of grants for vocational education from sources both public and private.
