

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6

Relating to the furnishing of reports on the activities of the division of personnel.

Be It Resolved by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session Assembled, the House Concurring:

WHEREAS, the Division of Personnel and the Personnel Board is an operating branch of the government of the State of Alaska, spending public monies and making decisions which affect the operating efficiency of all branches of the state government; and

WHEREAS, the legislature must have sufficient information on a continuing basis to determine whether the program and policies as set out in the law are being correctly and efficiently carried out; and

WHEREAS, the legislature must also be able to determine what changes in laws and policy, if any, are necessary in order to permit the business of the state to be carried on expeditiously and efficiently through its employees;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session assembled, the House of Representatives concurring, that the legislature respectfully requests that the governor instruct the director of personnel and the personnel board to submit an annual report similar to those submitted by other divisions of the state government.

The report should include, in addition to such other information as the governor may direct:

A chart showing the number of state employees in each pay grade at the beginning and end of the fiscal year, by agencies.

A statement of the maximum and minimum number of persons employed during the fiscal year.

A summary by agency of turnover information, i. e. the number of new hires, termination and transfers.

The number of examinations given.

The number of requests for review, appeals and grievances handled.

A resume of changes made in personnel rules and job classifications.

Recommendations for such changes in laws and general pay levels as the personnel board may deem appropriate.

Copies of the report should be made available to unions of state employees in order to implement the purposes of Chapter 108, Session Laws of Alaska, 1959.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7

Relating to a feasibility study for the establishment of a non-profit exclusive state workmen's compensation fund.

Be It Resolved by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session Assembled, the House Concurring:

WHEREAS, the Legislature now has before it Senate Bill No. 80 and House Bill No. 209, which provide for the creation of a non-profit exclusive state workmen's compensation fund; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature is cognizant of the desirability and need of having public hearings on the subject before it can

take appropriate action;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session assembled, the House concurring, that the Legislative Council and the Commissioners of Commerce and Labor hold public hearings on the subject of a non-profit exclusive state fund and Workmen's Compensation Insurance premium rates now in effect and in conjunction with the Legislative Council report their findings to the Second Legislature, Second Session, on the day it convenes.
