

commissioner requires, in cash or by certified check, cashier's check, or money order, in accordance with his bid. The director or his representative shall immediately issue a receipt containing a description of the land or interest leased, the price bid, and terms of the lease. The receipt shall be acknowledged in writing by the bidder. A lease on a form

approved by the attorney general shall be signed by the lessee and, upon approval by the commissioner, shall be signed by the director.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 27

AN ACT

Relating to the filing of orders creating controlled livestock districts; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 140)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 03.35.030 is amended to read:

Sec. 03.35.030. **Notice, Hearing, and Order.** Upon receipt of a petition for the establishment of a controlled livestock district, the magistrate shall set a time for hearing the petition within not less than 30 days. Notice of the time and place of the hearing and its purpose shall be posted in not less than three conspicuous public places within the proposed district, including a post office, for a period of at least 30 days before the hearing. If there is no post office within the proposed district, then the notice

shall be posted in two conspicuous public places in the proposed district and in the post office nearest the proposed district. If, at the hearing, the district magistrate finds that the petition is sufficient and that notice of the hearing has been given, he shall enter an order creating and establishing the controlled livestock district and describing its boundaries. The district magistrate shall certify to the clerk of the superior court for the judicial district a copy of his findings and order. He shall send a copy of the order to the director, division of agriculture, Department of Natural Resources.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 28

AN ACT

Relating to a preference to veterans in the disposition of certain state lands.

(H.B. 157)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 38.05.067(a) is amended to read:

(a) Before offering to the general public any unoccupied residential lands, the director shall offer the land at a restricted sale at which only veterans may buy.
