

Sec. 16.05.792. Qualifications of Master Guide. Additional to normal guide qualifications and in recognition of exceptional experience and meritorious performance there is created the category of master guide. An applicant for a master guide rating must

(1) have legally hunted in Alaska for a part of each of 10 years during which his principal source of income was from guiding or related activities directly contributing to his experience and competency as a guide;

(2) have held a registered guide license (other than assistant guide license), be actively engaged in licensed guiding activities in Alaska and have been so for at least five years under either the state or federal guide programs;

(3) not have been convicted of a violation of state sport fishing, game or guiding laws, or regulations within the preceding five years;

(4) have consistently performed in a superior manner as evidenced by required reports submitted to the de-

partment and by inquiries made by the board to at least two the guide's clients of record.

Sec. 16.05.795. License Not Required. A master guide is not required to have a guide license.

Sec. 16.05.796. Use of Title. (a) Unless he possesses a current master guide certificate, no person may use the title "master guide" in connection with his name.

(b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 16.05.798. Register. In the guide register, the department shall list all guides in alphabetical order and shall state the qualifications and experience requirements of guides and master guides. The department shall make the register readily available to the public.

Sec. 9. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 76

AN ACT

Authorizing the commissioner of natural resources to grant extensions of time for payment on any lease or sale of state land, minerals, or materials, when he finds that compliance with the requirements is prevented by reason of war, riots, or Acts of God; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 428)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 38.05.020 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(5) notwithstanding the provisions of any other section of this chapter, grant an extension of the time within which payments due on any lease or sale of state land, minerals, or materials may be made, including payment of rental and royalties, if he finds

that compliance with the requirements is or was prevented by reason of war, riots, or Acts of God.

Sec. 2. This Act is expressly declared to be retrospective to March 27, 1964.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 77

AN ACT

Relating to exemption from bonding requirements for construction of pioneer access roads and emergency highway repair projects; and providing for an effective date.

(S.B. 106)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 36.25.010 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(c) This section does not apply to the construction of pioneer access roads nor to emergency highway repair contracts costing less than \$20,000, except that the commissioner of highways may require a payment or per-

formance bond. The commissioner of highways shall not approve final payments to the contractor, however, until the contractor files a written certification that all wages, materials, and subcontractors have been paid.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 78

AN ACT

Relating to required teacher units under the public school foundation program.

(S.B. 344)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 14.17.050(h) is amended to read:

(h) This schedule of allowable number of teacher units is only for use in determining allotments under the public school foundation program, and does not prohibit a district from hir-

ing a greater number of teachers to be paid from its own funds. If a district operates any school with less than 301 pupils in a remote and isolated area, the state Board of Education may order that school to be treated as a separate district for the purpose of determining the allowable number of teacher units the district is entitled to for that school under (d) of this section.

CHAPTER 79

AN ACT

Relating to powers of the Alaska State Housing Authority; and providing for an effective date.

(C.S.H.B. 448)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 18.55.100 is amended to read:

Sec. 18.55.100. Powers of Authority.

(a) The authority has all powers necessary to carry out the purposes of secs. 10 - 290 of this chapter including but not limited to the following:

- (1) sue and be sued;
- (2) adopt a seal;
- (3) have perpetual succession;
- (4) adopt, amend, and repeal by-laws, rules, and regulations;

(5) make and execute contracts and other instruments;

(6) in its own name, own, exchange, transfer, lease, rent, convey, or acquire by eminent domain under AS 09.55.240 - 09.55.460, or otherwise, real and personal property; provided that no project site or part of a project site may be acquired by eminent domain until the authority has secured, through negotiation, options for the purchase of at least 50 per cent of the properties included in the site, except in disaster areas;

(7) provide, subject to the applicable planning, zoning, sanitary and building laws, ordinances and regula-
