

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 20

**Relating to a study of methods of revising the Alaska Administrative Code.**

**Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate Concurring:**

WHEREAS Alaska's administrative regulations comprise an important body of law; and

WHEREAS, in several areas of law, such as natural resources, health and welfare, education, and fish and game, the regulations affect the public more directly than the statutes in those areas do; and

WHEREAS administrative regulations are compiled into the Alaska Administra-

tive Code; and

WHEREAS the code is poorly drafted, has no usable index, is confusingly organized, and is printed on paper and with type that is hard to read;

BE IT RESOLVED that the legislative council is directed to study alternative methods for and costs of revising the Alaska Administrative Code and to submit a report on its study to the members of the legislature at the beginning of the 1964 legislative session.

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 28

**Relating to the inauguration of a U. S. Savings Stamp program in the schools of the state.**

**Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate Concurring:**

WHEREAS leaders in finance, industry, and education agree that this country needs more savings of all kinds to assure our continuing growth and prosperity; and

WHEREAS the U. S. Treasury-sponsored school Savings Stamp program, which has enjoyed nation-wide success in every state in the Union except Alaska, is one good way of teaching thrift to aid in this accumulation of greater national savings; and

WHEREAS the teaching of thrift as character-building training for youngsters is properly within the province of the class-

room; and

WHEREAS schools can and should teach thrift as a benefit, not only to individual students, but to the Nation; and

WHEREAS there is now a U. S. Savings Bonds office in Alaska which will aid in the inauguration of a school Savings Stamp program in Alaska;

BE IT RESOLVED that the state Department of Education is urged to encourage the inauguration of a U. S. Savings Stamp program in the schools in the State of Alaska; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the state Board of Education and the state director of the U. S. Savings Bonds Division of the Treasury Department.

**Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate Concurring:**

WHEREAS God in his wisdom has seen fit to call to her eternal rest Marie Drake, one of the most distinguished citizens of

the State of Alaska; and

WHEREAS Marie Drake was for many years connected with the school system of the Territory of Alaska, during which period of service she traveled to some of the most remote places in the Territory; and

WHEREAS, through such travel and contact with the people in all parts of the Territory, she acquired a great love for Alaska; and

WHEREAS her love for Alaska inspired Marie Drake to write that immortal ode to our northern land, The Alaska Flag; and

WHEREAS music was written for the said poem, which lyrics and music were officially adopted as the Alaska Flag Song; and

WHEREAS the people of Alaska have been and always will be thrilled by the rendition of Marie Drake's wonderful

masterpiece and the stirring words thereof; and

WHEREAS the State of Alaska has suffered a great loss in the death of Marie Drake;

BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives and the Senate of the Third Legislature, First Session, express their esteem and profound sorrow in the passing of Marie Drake, and that they extend their condolence to the members of her family in their loss.

### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 31

**Relating to interim hearings on the proposed Alaska Water Use Act.**

**Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate Concurring:**

WHEREAS a proposed Alaska Water Use Act has been submitted to the Legislature as House Bill No. 73 and House Bill No. 167; and

WHEREAS this proposed Act is of a very technical nature and vitally affects business activity and the development and use of the water resources of the state; and

WHEREAS the interim between sessions affords an excellent opportunity to hear

the public regarding its views on the proposed Water Use Act;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Department of Natural Resources in conjunction with the Department of Fish and Game, the Department of Health and Welfare, and the Legislative Council hold interim public hearings on the proposed Water Use Act, House Bill No. 73 and House Bill No. 167, and submit its findings and any recommendations for change to the Legislature in January of 1964.

### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 32

**Relating to the extension of "C" Street in the Anchorage urban area to a point south of the International Airport Road.**

**Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate Concurring:**

WHEREAS the Department of Highways has formulated the primary road system in the Anchorage urban area, but has not yet formulated the secondary road system; and

WHEREAS the need for the secondary road system is, in many cases, as pressing as for the primary road system; and

WHEREAS that need is felt particularly in the lack of a direct access route from the city to the International Airport Road; and

WHEREAS, if "C" Street were extended from Sixth Avenue to beyond the International Airport Road, it would be a direct traffic route out of Anchorage to the airport and the residential area south of the city, affording early, inexpensive relief of the Anchorage area's traffic congestion;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is respectfully urged to direct the Depart-
