

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 9

Requesting a study regarding ferry connections for Hoonah and Kake.

Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives:

WHEREAS the towns of Hoonah and Kake are located on islands and now have no state highway or ferry connection with the other towns of Southeast Alaska; and

WHEREAS a connection with other communities would be of economic and other benefit to these two towns; and

WHEREAS a connection with the Southeast Alaska ferry system on trips to and from Sitka appears to be the most feasible way of giving Hoonah and Kake the needed connection with other communities;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to direct the Division of Marine Transportation, Department of Public Works, to make a study of the need, cost, and feasibility of serving the towns of Hoonah and Kake.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 12

Relating to the death of Mildred R. Hermann.

Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives:

WHEREAS an outstanding Alaskan, Mildred R. Hermann, has been taken in death; and

WHEREAS the late Mildred R. Hermann is identified in the minds and hearts of many Alaskans as an active citizen dedicated to and working for the public good; and

WHEREAS her record of public service was highlighted by her leadership in the Alaska statehood movement as secretary of the Alaska Statehood Committee and as a delegate to the Alaska Constitutional Convention; and

WHEREAS, in addition to her dedicated public service as a participant in and observer of the public affairs of the territory and state, Mrs. Hermann established a commendable record as an at-

torney who devoted much of her time to legal work for the less fortunate; and

WHEREAS her zest for work and accomplishment found her a leader in the activities of the Alaska Cancer Society, the Alaska Tuberculosis Association, the Heart Association, and other organizations dedicated to active programs for the betterment of society and her community and state;

BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives does hereby express its profound sadness at the passing of Mildred R. Hermann, an outstanding citizen and friend of Alaska and all its aspires to, and commends to the attention of all Alaskans her forthrightness, honesty, and diligence as a public and private citizen as a model of good and effective citizenship. The House of Representatives hereby expresses its sincerest condolences to her family at this time of loss and grief.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 16

Requesting the expansion of federal programs to meet the effects of the natural disaster on the state school system.

Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives:

WHEREAS the earthquake disaster has had a grave impact on the public education program and system of the state through the destruction of school facilities and the loss of revenues vital to the existence of education; and
