AN ACT

Providing for the observance of Arbor Day.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 41.15 is amended by adding a new section to read:

ARTICLE 3. FOREST RESOURCE CONSERVATION.

Sec. 41.15.400. OBSERVANCE OF ARBOR DAY. To increase public awareness of the vital importance of the conservation and propagation of trees and forests to the everyday life of the citizens of Alaska, the first Monday in May of each year is designated "Arbor Day". It shall be observed by appropriate school assemblies and programs and may be the occasion for other suitable observances and exercises by civic groups and the public in general.
