AN ACT

Relating to the powers of councils of fourth class cities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 29.25 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 29.25.185. COMPENSATION. The council may by ordinance fix a compensation for members of the council for the performance of duties as councilmen.

* Sec. 2. AS 29.25.190 is amended to read:

Sec. 29.25.190. APPOINTMENT. The council may appoint a clerk, a treasurer who shall be bonded in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 as determined by the council, an assessor, a chief of police, and such other officers or employees as it considers necessary, and may fix their compensation by ordinance. No officer or employee may be appointed for a term longer than one year nor beyond the term for which members of the council are elected. The council may, if it elects, select a clerk, treasurer, and other officers or employees from among its own number and may by ordinance

ratified by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the question at the next general election following the selection fix a compensation for performance of the duties of the office or employment. The compensation may be payable in addition to compensation which may be fixed under sec. 185 of this chapter for the performance of duties as councilmen and as council president.
