

CHAPTER 115

AN ACT

Increasing the salaries of the governor, secretary of state, the heard of departments, and the judges of the supreme and superior courts; and providing for an effective date.

(C.S.S.B. 147)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 39.20.010 is amended to read:

Sec. 39.20.010. **Annual Salary of Governor.** The annual salary of the governor is \$27,500. The salary shall be paid in equal monthly installments.

Sec. 2. AS 39.20.030 is amended to read:

Sec. 39.20.030. **Annual Salary of Secretary of State.** The annual salary of the secretary of state is \$21,000. The salary shall be paid in equal monthly installments.

Sec. 3. AS 39.20.080 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

Sec. 39.20.080. **Salaries of Department Heads.** The head of each principal executive department of the state upon appointment and qualification is entitled to an annual salary. The annual salary of each department head is \$20,000, except that the annual salary of the adjutant

general is \$17,000.

Sec. 4. AS 22.05.140(a) is amended to read:

(a) The chief justice shall receive \$25,500 annually, and each associate justice shall receive \$24,500 annually as compensation. The compensation is payable monthly in 12 equal installments. Compensation of the chief justice or of an associate justice shall not be diminished during his term of office, unless by general law applying to all salaried officers of the state.

Sec. 5. AS 22.10.190(a) is amended to read:

(a) Each superior court judge shall receive \$21,000 annually, as compensation, payable monthly in 12 equal installments. The compensation of a judge shall not be diminished during his term in office, unless by general law applying to all salaried officers of the state.

Sec. 6. This Act takes effect July 1, 1965.

CHAPTER 116

AN ACT

Relating to the driving of a vehicle, watercraft or an aircraft without the owner's consent.

(S.C.S.H.B. 179)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 11.20 is amended by adding new sections to read:

Sec. 11.20.145. **Driving or Taking Watercraft or Aircraft Without the Owner's Consent.** (a) A person who drives, tows away, or takes a watercraft or an aircraft not his own without the consent of the owner, with intent temporarily to deprive the owner of possession of the watercraft or aircraft or a person who is a party or accessory to or an accom-

plice in the unauthorized driving, towing, or taking, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction is punishable by imprisonment for not more than one year, or by a fine of not more than \$1,000, or by both. The consent of the owner of a watercraft or an aircraft to its driving, towing away, or taking shall not be presumed or implied because of the owner's consent on previous occasions to the driving, towing away or taking of the watercraft or aircraft by the same or a different person.
