AN ACT

To amend the definition of the practice of hairdressing and beauty culture.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 08.28.320(10) is amended to read:

(10) "practice of hairdressing and beauty culture" is engaging, for compensation or other reward, in any of the following practices: (A) arranging, dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, singeing, bleaching, coloring, or similar work on a wig or hair piece of artificial or human hair, including a man's toupee, or upon the hair of a living person by any means; (B) trimming women's hair, as a part of women's hairdressing; (C) utilizing cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or creams, with the hands or with a mechanical or electrical apparatus, in massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, or beautifying the scalp, face, neck, arms, hands, bust, or upper part of the body of a person, for the purpose of beautification;
