

LAWS OF ALASKA, 1965

CHAPTER 1

AN ACT

Appropriating to the Department of Health and Welfare for preliminary work on state buildings; providing for repayment to the general fund; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 78)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of \$200,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Health and Welfare for preliminary work on the state buildings authorized by ch. 118, SLA 1964, and by the qualified voters of the state.

Sec. 2. The amount appropriated by this Act shall be reimbursed to the general fund from the state health and welfare

facilities construction fund from the proceeds of bonds issued after the effective date of this Act and appropriated in the general appropriation bill of the First Session of the Fourth State Legislature.

Sec. 3. The appropriation made by this Act is for capital purposes and is subject to the provisions of AS 37.25.020.

Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 2

AN ACT

Relating to an investigation fee for an out-of-state hairdressing or beauty culture license.

(H.B. 19)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 08.28.140 is amended to read:

Sec. 08.28.140. **Out-Of-State Licenses.** A person holding a current valid license from a board of cosmetology in another state is entitled to a license under this

chapter without examination if he applies, accompanying his application with

(1) proof of a foreign license;

(2) proof that he has completed at least 2,000 hours' training in a hairdressing and beauty culture school;

(3) payment of a \$25 investigation fee.

CHAPTER 3

AN ACT

Relating to the levy of special assessments by political subdivisions of the state for water supply and distribution systems; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 72)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 29.10.246 is amended to read:

Sec. 29.10.246. Assessments for Improvements Against Property Benefited.

The council may assess against the real property specially benefited by the improvements two-thirds of the cost of laying out, grading, constructing or repairing a street, alley or sidewalk, constructing or repairing a sewer or drain, constructing or repairing water supply and distribution systems, acquiring and constructing parks or playgrounds or making changes in channels of streams or watercourses or constructing, erecting, strengthening or repairing bulkheads, embankments or dikes for streams or watercourses. The costs shall be assessed against the real property specifically benefited in proportion to the benefits received by each tract of land. However, no assessment may be levied for an improvement unless the improvement is requested of the city council in writing by the owners of at least one-half in value of the property to be specifically benefited by the improvement. The expense assessed may include the cost to the city of acquiring premises for the improvements.

Sec. 2. AS 29.10.297 is amended to read:

Sec. 29.10.297. Street, Water and Sewer Improvements by Districts. In cities of the first class, the council, by general ordinance or special ordinance or both may create and maintain street, water and sewer improvement districts, and establish, change and revise their boundaries from time to time; erect, build, establish, lay out, alter, open, improve and repair streets, sewers, water supply and distribution systems, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges, squares and other public highways and places within the city, and drain, sprinkle and light them; remove all obstructions; establish grades; grade, plank, pave, macadamize, gravel and curb them, in whole or in part, and construct gutters, culverts, sidewalks and crosswalks, and levy, apportion, assess and collect the cost or any part of it against and from the property within the improvement district. The council may determine what work shall be done or improvements made at the expense, in whole or in part, of the owners adjoining, contiguous or proximate property, or non-contiguous and other properties within an improvement district specially benefited thereby, and provide for the manner of making, apportioning, and collecting assessments therefor.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 4

AN ACT

Limiting the rank of the adjutant general and designating the official to whom he makes reports.

(H.B. 84)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 26.05.160(a) is amended to read:

(a) The adjutant general of the state is appointed by the governor. The governor shall prescribe the rank of the adjutant general which shall not exceed

major general. To be eligible for appointment as adjutant general, a person shall be a citizen of the state. The adjutant general shall make returns and reports to the Chief, National Guard Bureau, and to the governor or to the officers of the Chief, National Guard Bureau, and the governor designate, at the times and in the form prescribed.
