## AN ACT

Penalizing persons who loiter about public schools as vagrants;  
and providing for an effective date.

---

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 11.60.210 is amended to read:

Sec. 11.60.210. VAGRANCY. An idle or dissolute person who has no visible means of living, or lawful occupation or employment by which to earn a living; an able-bodied person found begging the means of support in public places, or from house to house, or who procures a child or children to do so; or a person who lives in a house of ill repute; or a person who, without legitimate reason, loiters about a school where children are in attendance is a vagrant, and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not less than \$20 nor more than \$250, or by imprisonment in a jail for not less than 10 days nor more than 25 days, or by both.

\* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
