

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of \$13,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Legislative Council for the additional legislative expense involved in implementing the tem-

porary employee salary schedule changes provided for in ch. 45, SLA 1965.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 80

AN ACT

Exempting banks from the corporation laws in AS 10; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 237)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 10.05.825(2) is amended to read:

(2) "corporation" or "domestic corporation" means a corporation for profit

subject to the provisions of this chapter, except a foreign corporation or a state or national bank;

CHAPTER 81

AN ACT

Relating to the provision of programs of education and training for exceptional children; and providing for an effective date.

(S.B. 54)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 14.30 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 14.30.185. **Programs Shall Be Established.** A school district or the department shall establish and operate programs for exceptional children.

Sec. 2. AS 14.30 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 14.30.186. **Coverage.** A program for exceptional children shall provide special services for each classification of exceptional children represented by not less than five children living in the area served by the program. However, nothing in this section shall prevent a program from being offered to classifications represented by less than five

children.

Sec. 3. AS 14.30.190 is amended to read:

Sec. 14.30.190. **Establishment of Standards by Department of Health and Welfare.** The Department of Health and Welfare shall establish by regulation standards for the evaluation and classification of the child's mental and physical status. The classification of exceptional children shall be devised so that the children within a given classification may successfully be provided special services in the same facilities and classes. The standards shall include provisions for reevaluation of the child in special classes at regular intervals.
